Five Facts about Human Trafficking

- At least 4.8 million people worldwide are trafficked for sexual exploitation
- 4.1 million people are trafficked around the world each year
- 70% of the time, the victims are women and girls
- One million children are trafficked for commercial sexual exploitation
- Roughly \$150 billion is earned worldwide by human trafficking a year
